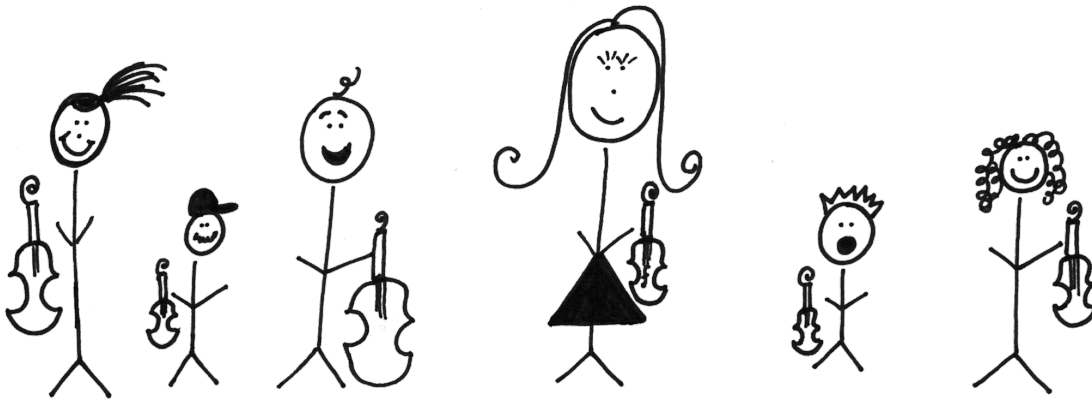

POLICIES

RATES

1. Private lessons: \$40/30 min., \$60/45 min., \$80/60 min., \$100/75 min., and \$120/90 min.
Group class: \$20 per student.
Accompanist fee: \$20 per student per recital.
Note: Lesson prices are subject to increase with inflation.
2. Tuition is billed monthly, paid in advance, and due the first of each month.
3. If tuition is forgotten or partial, there is no penalty if received before the end of the due date. Otherwise, there is a \$10 late fee, and lessons will be forfeit until tuition and any late fees are paid in full.
4. Tuition totals are fixed and non-adjustable. Lesson credits must be requested prior to billing. Any credits requested after billing will be applied to the following month's tuition.
5. Invoices for the upcoming tuition cycle will be distributed electronically via My Music Staff. (Invoices will also indicate any dates when lessons will not be held.)
6. I accept payments via Zelle, PayPal*, cash, and checks (made out to Jennifer Yarbrough or The Yarbrough Studio).
*A 3.3% service fee applies for credit cards.

ATTENDANCE & RESCHEDULING

1. Students are expected to attend weekly private lessons. A student's day/time is reserved unless otherwise rescheduled.
2. If a student needs an occupied lesson slot, parents may contact each other to swap.
3. If a student is tardy, the lesson continues for the remainder of the scheduled time and cannot be rescheduled, credited, refunded, or run overtime. If a student arrives early, the lesson will begin at the scheduled time.
4. Students are permitted up to two lesson credits per academic year (September – August), for excused absences only. Credits renew each September, and unused credits do not carry over from one year to the next.
5. Students are permitted up to four rescheduled lessons per academic year (September–August), for excused absences only. Once these four reschedules have been used, students may attend their regularly scheduled lesson in person or online, opt for an asynchronous lesson, or cancel without a credit or refund. Rescheduled lessons renew each September, and unused reschedules do not carry over from one year to the next.

6. **Excused Absences:** When notified of a lesson cancellation a minimum of 24-hours in advance, lessons may be rescheduled within 30 days of the date missed. Beyond then, the lesson is forfeit.
7. **Unexcused Absences:** If a lesson is cancelled with less than 24-hours' notice or the student does not show up, the lesson is forfeit and cannot be rescheduled, credited or refunded.
8. **Illness:** Please stay home if you are feeling at all unwell. Families may opt for a virtual lesson at the regularly scheduled day/time in the event of illness. Anyone attending lessons in person who is presenting symptoms (coughing, sneezing, runny nose, sore throat, etc.) may be sent home without rescheduling or credit.
9. Should I need to cancel lessons beyond what is documented on the monthly invoice or in the event of unforeseen circumstances, I will communicate via email and either provide a virtual option, reschedule, or credit the lesson toward the next tuition cycle.
10. Group classes, play-ins, and accompanist fees cannot be credited or refunded.
11. Students are responsible for scheduling make-up lessons. Otherwise, the lesson is forfeit.
12. If a student cancels a make-up lesson, there will be no further rescheduling, credit, or refund.
13. Students that miss two or more lessons consecutively without prior notice, arrive late or cancel on a frequent basis, or opt to take a break from lessons may lose their spot in the studio without refund.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

1. The Studio will be closed if:
 - Critical access points to the studio are impassable or unsafe.
 - Bremerton School District cancels school.
2. Communication via email will be sent as soon as possible.
3. Students may:
 - Attend their lesson if the studio is open.
 - Opt for an online or asynchronous lesson if the studio is closed or if travel conditions are unsafe.
4. No credits or refunds will be given.
5. If a group class, performance, or other event is cancelled, every effort will be made to reschedule.

COMMUNICATION

1. In communicating with me, please utilize (in the following order):
 1. e-mail
 2. text
 3. phone
 4. note or letter
2. Please do not call or text before 8:00 AM or after 8:00 PM.
3. All visits to the studio outside of a student's assigned lesson/group class time must be scheduled with the teacher prior to arriving at the studio.

BOUNDARIES

My violin, bow, case, and all contents within are off limits unless it is in imminent danger or I have specifically instructed the child or parent to touch it.

GROUP CLASS

1. Group classes occur approximately twice per month during the academic year. Families will be notified of dates, times, and locations well in advance.
2. Students are expected to attend group class in addition to private lessons and to make group class a top priority in the event of scheduling conflicts with other activities.
3. Students may be exempt from group class participation if there are no other students at a comparable level with whom to form an appropriate class, or if participation in another comparable musical ensemble (such as a youth orchestra) conflicts with the scheduled group class.
4. Students that cancel for group class more than twice per term are missing a critical component of the Suzuki experience and may lose their spot in the studio.

PERFORMANCE

1. Performances, such as recitals and outreach concerts, occur at least twice a year. Families will be notified of dates, times, locations, and repertoire well in advance.
2. Participation in studio performances is mandatory unless there is a pre-existing, legitimate conflict (e.g., religious, school, or family obligations). Trips or vacations may be excused only if they were planned prior to the distribution of the studio calendar and are communicated promptly upon receipt of the calendar. Unforeseen circumstances (e.g., major events such as championships, funerals, illness, severe weather, or other circumstances beyond the student's control) may also warrant an excused absence.
3. Students who are unable to participate in required performances without an approved exception may forfeit their place in the studio, without refund.

PRACTICE & LESSON PREPARATION

1. Students are expected to prepare for each lesson, putting practice and consideration into the assignments given the previous lesson.
2. If unprepared or in cases of extreme negligence, a student may be dismissed from a lesson without rescheduling, credit, or refund. If the issue persists, a parent/teacher conference may be necessary, and ultimately, the student may lose their spot in the studio without refund.
3. Students are responsible for purchasing and bringing all assigned materials to each lesson. If a student arrives without necessary materials, I will teach as much as I am able based on the limitations but may dismiss the student early without a credit or rescheduling.
4. Students should have newly assigned materials by the following lesson. If requested, I am happy to purchase new materials for the student and be reimbursed.

LISTENING

1. Daily listening to the Suzuki reference recordings and other assigned listening is an ongoing assignment throughout the student's musical study.
2. Especially in the early years, parents are responsible for purchasing the CD, keeping multiple copies (at least four are recommended) readily available, and ensuring that this is a part of the child's daily environment.
3. If the child is sick or unable to practice, he or she can still learn through listening.

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

The following is applicable for students under the approximate ages of 11 -13:

1. Parents are responsible for daily practicing and listening with their child.
2. Parents are expected to observe lessons and learn alongside their child so they can establish and guide the daily practice routine.
3. The parent that will be practicing with the child at home is the parent that should be attending private and group lessons. In the event that someone else must bring the child, the lesson should be video recorded for the practicing parent.
4. During the lesson, parents should stay present with the child and attentive, taking thorough notes or video recordings. Please keep electronic devices otherwise put away and in silent mode for both lessons and group classes.
5. I kindly ask that parents not answer for/coach their children or otherwise interrupt, distract, or interfere while I'm teaching.

6. Should the child become upset during a group class or lesson, I kindly ask parents, *only when invited to do so*, to intervene.

FINGERNAILS

Students are expected to keep fingernails trimmed short in order to play with proper technique and are advised to keep a pair of nail clippers in their case at all times. Please handle trimming and other grooming at home.

RESPECT & BEHAVIOR

1. Students and parents are expected to be cooperative, respectful, and positive in their attitudes, words, and actions towards me, other students and parents, instruments, and music.
2. Should any disciplinary issues arise during a lesson or group class, I kindly ask parents, *only when invited to do so*, to intervene; otherwise, please allow me to handle it.
3. Serious displays of disrespect, a bad attitude, or refusal to cooperate may result in dismissal from a lesson or from the studio without rescheduling, credit, or refund.

DISCONTINUATION

1. Beginning students commit to lessons for at least two years. Parents are encouraged to take responsibility of all decisions regarding the continuance of lessons in the early years, as children are not necessarily able to make decisions in their best interests yet.
2. If considering discontinuation, I appreciate when a parent and student are proactive and open in communicating with me ASAP so that we might work together to resolve any issues, if possible.
3. I must be notified a minimum of 24 hours prior to whenever the next lesson would otherwise occur if discontinuing.
4. There are no refunds if lessons are discontinued before the end of the current tuition cycle.

MEDIA

Media is a part of our studio environment, as well as a great way to learn together, build community, and share our music with others. Pictures and videos from lessons, performances, and group classes may be posted online.

1. If there is any concern, please let me know so we can find a solution that works for everyone.
2. Posts may be unlisted, omit details, cover faces, or have limited access in order to protect privacy.
